In January 2016, we will offer a course on **Software Design** (CS 618) on **Tuesday and Thursdays** at **lunchtime** (1230 – 145 pm). The course will be taught by Dr. Jane Hayes of the University of Kentucky.

The course:

This course provides an overview of the software design field: software design overview, software design process, a survey of software design methods (such as structured design methods, object-oriented design methods, concurrent design methods), and design reviews. The course will address object-oriented programming, refactoring, and design patterns. The course will cover architectural as well as detailed design. Testing and validation techniques will be emphasized throughout the course. Program designs will be developed and validated throughout the course. Readings and summaries of current and seminal journal papers and texts will be required.
